A. Addiction Treatment and Detoxification Programs (Medically Supervised)

1. Daughters and Sisters

Provided by: PLEA Community Services Society of BC

Service Description

Residential addiction treatment program for young women ages 12 to 18 on probation. Participants reside in PLEA family care with families trained in detox, stabilization, and support recovery, while receiving day, evening, and weekend treatment at a separate facility. The six-month program includes individual and group counselling, parent-teen mediation, ongoing assessment, teacher-supervised education, and social and recreational activities. Tailored to individual needs and strengths, the program aims to increase self-esteem while decreasing substance abuse, criminal activity, and high-risk behaviour. Referrals accepted from probation officers, parents, social workers, counsellors, or agencies. Office hours are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday. Funded by the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD)

2. Waypoint Program

Provided by: PLEA Community Services Society of BC

Service Description

Four-month addiction treatment program for BC male youth ages 12 to 18 on probation. Participants reside in a PLEA family care home with caregivers trained in detox, stabilization, and support recovery. At a separate facility, they receive day, evening, and weekend treatment, including counselling (individual, group, and family), support groups, parent-teen mediation, ongoing assessment, teacher-supervised education, and social and recreational activities. Referrals for funded program are accepted from probation officers across BC; private fee-for-service referrals accepted from parents, social workers, addiction counsellors, and other professionals across Canada.

3. John Volken Academy

Agency and Service Description

A minimum two-year abstinence-based, residential treatment program and life-skills training centre for women and men ages 19 to 34. Clients must be detoxed prior to admission. Accepts clients on suboxone, as long as they are on a taper plan from their doctor; does not accept clients on methadone maintenance. Charges a one-time intake fee of \$5,000. Open referral. Intake hours are 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday. Service is provided in English; other languages may be available depending on staffing. No access to interpretation provided. Registered with the Assisted Living Registry, Ministry of Health. Nonprofit society.

4. Provincial Substance Use Treatment Program

Provided by: BC Mental Health and Substance Use Services

Service Description

Provides structured, supportive residential substance use treatment programs for individuals ages 19 years or over who have substance use concerns that have not been successfully addressed at the community level. Program is 90 days with six to 12 months of aftercare support. Services include assessment, stabilization, treatment, education, family programs, and alternative therapies. Referral required through a regional Health Authority. Services are provided under contract by Phoenix Society in Surrey and Cedars at Cobble Hill on Vancouver Island; see independent listings for details.

5. Path to Freedom Alcohol and Drug Treatment Centre

Agency Description

90-day residential treatment program for up to 10 men. Provides a structured environment, with participation required in classes covering a range of addiction/recovery-related topics, and 12-step groups. Services include individual and group counselling, and life skills training. Service offered in English and Punjabi. Does not provide access to interpreter services. Referral required from Fraser Health. Intake and office hours are 8 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday. Accepts men on methadone maintenance. Cost is \$60 per day, except for welfare clients. Funded as a Stabilization and Transitional Living Residence (STLR) by Fraser Health. Also offers an after-care program, and second-stage housing with a structured program that permits return to work/school, allowing men to integrate back into community while rebuilding their lives.

6. LUNAR Program

Provided by: Phoenix Drug and Alcohol Recovery and Education Society (aka Phoenix Society)

Service Description

Offers an evidence-based, residential addiction treatment program for women ages 19 and up who have serious substance use concerns, or have concurrent disorders. Program capacity is 18 women at a time. Accepts women on methadone maintenance. Average length of stay is from three to six months based on client goals and treatment plans. Services include individualized and group counselling, psycho-educational groups, relapse prevention support, peer support, medical support, job readiness and skills development training, family program, referrals, aftercare planning/support, and more. Philosophy is positive, strengths-based, and participant-centered. The focus of treatment is on healing and restoration through the development of healthy relationships, while supporting individuals to identify and build on their own unique strengths. Self-referral or referral from a health professional accepted. Fee is \$40 per day, but cost is covered for participants referred by a health professional through the Provincial Substance Use Treatment Program; see website for a referral package. Intake hours are 8 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Thursday. Office hours are 8 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday. Wheelchair accessible. Partially funded by Fraser Health and BC Mental Health and Substance Use Services.

7. The Phoenix Centre - Phoenix Residential Addiction Treatment

Provided by: Phoenix Drug and Alcohol Recovery and Education Society (aka Phoenix Society)

Service Description

Provides licensed residential addiction services that focus on stabilization from an addiction-based lifestyle for men 19 years and older. The 28 stabilization beds are for men in early recovery; the first 90 days (minimum stay) requires full-time participation. Accepts men on opiate replacement therapies. Services include case management, substance misuse awareness and education, individual and group counselling, relapse prevention and health promotion training, health care coaching, stress and emotional management training, mindfulness, 12-step meetings, and employment and housing assistance. Using a modified therapeutic community model of services, the centre is based on a biopsychosocial model of addiction and reflects a developmental model of recovery. Accepts self-referrals; intake hours are 1 pm to 3 pm Monday to Thursday. Service is offered in English only; access to interpretation services is not provided. Funded by Fraser Health.

Residential programs for male federal parolees age 19 and older who have concurrent disorders, a brain injury, or mental health disability, and who are reintegrating into the community. Offers counselling, resources about relapse prevention, and employment readiness guidance. Resource room provides computers, internet access, videos, and workbooks for employment search, as

Agency Description

Residential 12-step recovery program for adults ages 19 and up. Offers facilities that are male-only, female-only, co-ed, and that can accommodate couples. Mandatory 90-day stay with certified individual, family, and group counselling, as well as Narcotics Anonymous (NA), and/or Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) meetings. Accepts individuals on substitution therapy. Cost is \$35.90 per day. Services are available in English, Punjabi, and Hindi. Does not provide access to language interpretation services. Serves Delta, Langley, Maple Ridge, New Westminster, Port Coquitlam, Richmond, and Surrey.

10. Mercy Canada (aka Mercy Multiplied Canada Society)

Agency Description

Christian-based, specialized residential program for up to 12 women ages 19 to 30 who are dealing with any number of life-controlling issues. Free program is approximately six to nine months, and is voluntary and highly structured. Services include residential care, individual and group counselling, nutritional education, fitness training, educational preparation, biblical teaching, and transitional planning. Accepts self-referrals; application forms can be downloaded from website. Clients must be clean/sober for 72 hours prior to intake; admission post-detox is considered on a case-by-case basis. Does not accept women on methadone maintenance or prescription narcotics. There may be staff available who speak other languages, but the program

does not offer access to an interpretation service. Wheelchair accessible. Office hours are 8 am to 5 pm Monday to Thursday.
