These are locations where vulnerable individuals, including those who are experiencing or are at risk of homelessness, would be able to recover and self-isolate during the COVID-19 outbreak. These sites will allow social distancing in existing shelters, free up acute care beds in hospitals, and prevent crowding. Some sites are reserved specifically for people who have COVID-19 and need a place to self-isolate while they recover. Other spaces are for patients being discharged from hospitals who do not have COVID-19 and who do not need emergency care, but still require ongoing health care. BC Housing works with Fraser Health (FH) and shelter and housing operators to make these spaces available; locations are confidential. Gives women a safe and supportive living environment with access to daily living requirements such as clothing, toiletries, and nutritious meals. Also provides one-to-one support, transportation, accompaniment, and advocacy support, as well as assists clients in accessing financial assistance, legal aid, and affordable housing.</p>

Health-related services include medication management, home nursing through referral, home care through referral, and oxygen tank storage. Pets are welcome. Wheelchair accessible. Operated in partnership with and funded by BC Housing and the City of Surrey.</p>

Also offers 20 transitional housing units for up to two years; rent is based on Income Assistance shelter rate. Referrals are accepted from self or other. No pets allowed. Wheelchair accessible.</p>

Must have completed a structured recovery program for at least three months and are motivated and ready to implement a personal recovery plan that includes employment and/or educational action plans. Support services include skill development in recovery maintenance, problem solving, and decision making; personal, financial, and stress management; and conflict resolution. Stay is up to two years. Accepts self-referrals. Fees are up to \$475 per month; additional \$25 parking fee. A Provincial Homelessness Initiative developed in partnership with BC Housing.</p>

Self-referrals are accepted. Funded by Government of Canada's Homelessness Partnering Strategy.</p>

Will accept men on methadone or suboxone under physician supervision if they can come off it safely. Residents must attend a minimum of four 12-step meetings or recovery-based meetings per week. Residents participate with chores and may work or study during residency; the average stay is one year. No wheelchair accessibility. Fees are charged; registered per diem facility with Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction (MSDPR). Recovery house is registered with the Assisted Living Registry, Ministry of Health. Intake and office hours are 8 am to 12 noon Monday to Friday.</p>

Referral accepted from self or other, including methadone maintenance clients wanting to deal with other additions. Office and intake hours are 9 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday. Recovery house registered with the Assisted Living Registry, Ministry of Health.</p>
